

MEDICAL BILLER

The Medical Biller certificate program prepares students to complete medical insurance claims for outpatient clinics and medical offices. Students receive training in anatomy & physiology, CPT and ICD coding, medical terminology, disease process, computer bookkeeping procedures, manual and computer insurance billing for commercial, Medicaid, Medicare, Worker's Compensation, and managed care plans.

PROGRAM RECOMMENDED PREPARATION

Strongly recommended for success in the program: ENGL 88 or ESL 186 or placement in ESL 188 or readiness for college-level English.

Recommended Prep: successful completion of Math 60 or placement in Math 70 or 80 or higher.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS: 18 years of age minimum

CERTIFICATION: The Medical Biller Program offers a Certificate of Achievement.

5 STEPS COLLEGE ADMISSION PROCEDURES

- 1. Apply for Admission: Go to Admissions & Registration or call 415-239-3285.
 - NEW CREDIT STUDENTS: Fill out a CCSF <u>credit</u> application at <u>Credit Admission</u> or call 415-239-3285
 - **RETURNING STUDENTS:** Have attended CCSF before as a <u>credit</u> student, but have not enrolled in courses for 2 consecutive semesters (Spring & Fall) or more, reapply (update your personal information) at <u>Credit Admissions</u>. Go to step 3. If you have only been away for one semester, you are considered a <u>Continuing Student</u>.
- 2. Attend an orientation for the health program of interest. After orientation if there are no questions about registration, tuition & fees, financial aid, or other student services go to step 5.
- 3. Meet with a CCSF Counselor (Counselors available at John Adams Center for Zoom counseling appointments, call 415-561-1925.)
- 4. Complete the Assessment: Go to <u>Assessment Center</u> or call 415-239-3751.

- **5.** Register for Classes: Go to Online Schedule.
